Sally Rogers and Claudia Schmidt January 14th at The Brink Lounge

Sally Rogers and Claudia Schmidt are coming to town! That's really 'nuff said. Every time these two impossibly gifted women team up -- and they've been teaming up for over thirty five years, including many a stop in Madison -- they drive their audiences wild with their songwriting, their solo and harmony singing, and their excellent musicianship. And as anyone who has been to one of their shows knows, that doesn't begin to explain the uncanny grip in which they hold the passions of their followers.

They have each produced dozens

of CDs, both solo and as a duo, a powerful, fun, high energy example of the latter being the 2016 release of the album "We Are Welcomed."

Chad Elliot Plays The Brink Lounge February 25th

Please join on February 25, 2016 when Chad Elliot makes his debut performance on our MadFolk Stage. I think I first saw Chad Elliot perform at the Folk Alliance Conference around 2007, he had already won a slot playing at FolkAlley's Festival, and within a year of our first meeting he won the Woody Guthrie song writing contest and was invited to play the Woody Guthrie festival, a festival that I had been attending for many years, and he has had many more honor and awards since then. So it has taken me 10 years to finally get Chad's schedule and the Madfolk schedule to work so we could present him on our stage. He comes from Iowa, home of folks that have had an influence on him, Greq Brown, Bo Ramsey and Dave Moore to be specific. I remember the first time I played one of Chad's CDs during a road trip with the family and they thought he had a sound of James Taylor. As any good artist does, he moves his sound around from standard singer songwriter, to some slide guitar and back again. Whatever style he is playing he does it well.

Chad will be touring in support of his newest CD – Wreck and Ruin. The title track was conceived after the Moore, Oklahoma tornado of 2013. Elliott didn't think too much of the song at the time he wrote it and put it aside. Its lyrics spell out a hopeless situation of a family expecting twins (Elliott being a twin himself). As the mother goes into labor the family finds itself in the back of a brokendown Chevy as a tornado bears down on the land. Nothing is left standing, except the family, now with two babies named "Wreck" and "Ruin."

One year after writing the song, on Mother's Day, 2014, Elliott and his family were celebrating at his mother's home in lowa. His hard-working, single mother raised four children alone. No

one minded when festivities closed early so his mother could attend a Lyle Lovett concert. Two hours after Elliott and his wife and children left, a tornado leveled his mother's house. Thankfully, no one was home. It could have been worse - the whole family would likely have been home, kids and all, if not for that Lyle Lovett concert. Elliott dusted off the "Wreck and Ruin" song to feature on this album, adopting the motto "Lyle Lovett Saves Lives."

MERGE RECORDS ~ 2016

As universally beloved (and now honored) as Bob Dylan is, probably no period of his lengthy career is as casually dismissed as the Eighties. Those seven studio albums, and we might as well include the last of Seventies, Street Legal and Slow Train Coming, were arguably overproduced, but on the bright side (for me at least)that meant horns and female backing vocals crammed into every song. I would not be the Dylan fan I am today had I never seen the video for "Jokerman," and thought "Hey, that's a pretty awesome song." To this day I name his 1983 release Infidels as one of my top five. The first time I heard Hiss Golden Messenger I thought, "Hey, that sounds like Eighties Bob Dylan." And for me, that was a very, very good thing.

Heart Like a Levee is MC Taylor's seventh release under the odd and unwieldy Hiss Golden Messenger moniker. The band was formed after the dissolution of Taylor's previous group, California based The Court & the Spark, when he and bandmate Scott Hirsch moved to North Carolina. In 2014 he signed to Merge records and released the brilliant Lateness of Dancers. Levee continues that winning streak, and maybe even ups the ante. Taylor's guitar and magnetic vocals anchor every track, but it's the Dylan-esque extras that make it so addictive. I'm sure he didn't set out to make a record that sounds like outtakes from Shot of Love, but that's what I hear in the lavers of vocals and horns. Right hand man and native Wisconsinite Phil Cook is omnipresent, lending backing vocals, keys and strings throughout. It's his banjo that buoys the infectious title track, and his clarinet on the trippy "Like a Mirror Loves a Hammer." The two songs appear back to back, but while the first is a light-hearted hallelujah with curious, discussion-provoking, lyrics like "I'm a peach tree jumper with rain in my shoes," the latter is pseudo-shoegaze, drenched in snare and saxophone. Try not to sway, I bet you can't do it.

While Phil and his brother Bradley (who plays bass on the record) fill out the low-end backing vocals nicely, they meet their match in Raleigh-Durham sirens Alexandra Sauser-Monnig (of the band Mountain Man) and Tift Merritt. The word association travelogue "As the Crow Flies" gives everyone room to shine. The chorus "Sing little bird, sing to high summer, don't get down, you're nothing but a number," gets more joyful with every repetition. The same choir, along with bouncy piano, reinforces the straightforward message of "Say It Like You Mean It," because "If you don't mean it, it don't mean anything at all," of course. Taylor's vocals are the focus, expertly laid over the multipart voices that give the record its signature sound, but every so often one of his backing vocalists gets called up. Taylor claims the melancholy "Happy Day (Sister My Sister)" was always envisioned as a Merritt duet. These are the kinds of dreams I like to see come true.

It would be hard to beat the one-two punch that opens Levee. It's the combination of the "Me & Bobby McGee" channeling acoustic guitar strum and the everyman lament "It's hard Lord, Lord it's hard" that makes opening track "Biloxi" the singalong standout. Meanwhile the

faux funky disco beat of "Tell Her I'm Just Dancing" takes the art of excuse making to a whole nother level. Who can argue when there's all that saxophone behind him? He must be dancing, I certainly am.
