October at Kiki's House of Righteous Music

works roll out all the new shows, but here at KHoRM I am all about the reruns. The four acts playing in the month of October are all frequent visitors who have logged an impressive amount of basement appearances. On October 14 Curtis McMurtry will make his third appearance. While three may not seem like a lot, it might have something to do with him being the youngest person to have played here. His first appearance came shortly after the release of his debut record Respectable Enemy in 2015. Between faith in his booking agent at Comboplate, and trust in genetics, I took a chance on an artist I hadn't seen before (having seen them play is my usual prerequisite). In that first appearance, the son of musician James and grandson of novelist Larry impressed everyone with solid songwriting and an endearing stage presence. McMurtry returned earlier this year with his sophomore effort Hornet's Nest which bests Enemy both musically and lyrically. Adventurous and addictive, the record relies on trumpet and cello instead of a traditional rhythm section. Which obviously makes them perfect for solo acoustic versions in the basement. During his shows McMurtry claims he only has had sad songs and mean songs, but I say he only has great songs. I'm delighted I only had to wait six months to have him back, two years was far too long.

The third weekend in October features a pair of artists who will each reach the half dozen appearance mark. Walter Salas-Humara, who returns October 21, actually played my third house concert ever with his band the Silos ten years ago. That was the probably moment I decided I wanted to do this as often as I can. And Salas-Humara has been coming back ever since. This time around he is touring with Jonathan Rundman, a multiinstrumentalist who will be opening as well as accompanying. Rundman just released the epic 22 song Reservoir, and still stands as the only person to bring a harmonium to the basement. The next night (October 22) marks the return of Peter Case, whose long and varied career has seen him play everything from new wave to delta blues. Amazingly, he remembers every show and everyone he's ever played with, and has the wealth of stories to prove it. His most re-

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cent show here in October of 2016 may have been my favorite yet, a perfect sampling of songs from throughout his career, and the sometimes unbelievable tales that go with them.

Salutations - conor oberst nonesuch - 2017

One could be forgiven for thinking Conor Oberst's new album Salutations sounds a lot like last year's Ruminations... because it does. In fact, it's the exact same set of ten songs, plus seven more for good luck. This time around, instead of solo Oberst on piano, guitar and harmonica, he's joined by superstar drummer Jim Keltner (who also co-produced), the majority of the Felice Brothers, and a host of ringers on backing vocals. Last year's release was gorgeous- a dark, meditative collection that reminds you exactly what's so great about Oberst's songwriting. In case you don't know, with other lyricists you can almost guess what's coming next, but with him it's a surprise. I was delighted that he tapped the Felice Brothers, who frequently join him during his annual stage takeover at Hardly Strictly Bluegrass, as his backing band on this record. A superior choice to the overrated Dawes (who backed him on Upside Down Mountain and too often fancied themselves The Band), the Brothers inject these songs with the same joyful, rollicking, singalong quality of their best tunes. Suddenly these dark songs seem a whole lot lighter, no longer a burden to be bourn alone.

The unexpected winner in the roulette of backing vocalists is Gillian Welch, who does her best Emmy Lou Harris on "You All Loved Him Once" and "Mamah Borthwick (a Sketch)." The cryptic former could be referring to Jesus just as easily as to a fallen teen idol, while the latter uses the tragic story of Frank Lloyd Wright's lover as a subtle cautionary tale, while also listing off some of Wright's most famous buildings. Azure Ray's Maria Taylor acquits herself nicely on the lovely "Barbary Coast (Later)," one of three tracks with a graceful string section. His Monsters of Folk bandmate Jim James reprises some of the vo-

cal magic that made their MoF debut outing so memorable. His wavering baritone underscores the middle of each verse of the deceptively chorusless "Gossamer Thin." A moody, introspective waltz, the track was also the highlight of the last record in its previous stripped-down incarnation. "Rings round his eyes, tracks down his arm, his fans are confused, his friends are alarmed," begins the first verse, though it doesn't seem genuinely troubling until later when the perspective switches to the first person. "I don't want to eat or get out of bed, I try to recall what the therapist said, Ego and Id the essential self, you are who you are and you are someone else."

The seven additional songs aren't any lighter thematically- there's still plenty of drugs, alcohol and mental illness- but they are strangely more upbeat. Opening track "Too Late to Fixate" meditates on the advantages of hiring an escort, "No I don't mind the money, it beats betting on sports, and though it might get expensive, it's cheaper than divorce." It's one of four featuring Now It's Overhead lead vocalist Andy LeMaster, who adds his voice to some or all of the Felice choir. They range from the namedropping firestorm of "Napalm" to the mysterious manhunt of the mellow "Empty Hotel by the Sea." The final track unites the two volumes, as well as providing this one's title and, most importantly, an explanation of the disquieting cover photo of Oberst facedown in a pool. "Salutations" the first verse begins, while the second parallels with "Ruminations," and eventually he thanks his savior. "You could have left me in the water, but you made me live again." Things may sound hopeless at times, but apparently Oberst will get by with a little help from his friends, musical and otherwise.
